Take the admission test

Register at <https://www.cisiaonline.it/en> and sign up for the CEnT-S or TOLC-I test with an English section, or the TOLC-S with an English section; or register at <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/> and sign up for the SAT.

Be sure to adhere to the dates specified in this announcement when taking the test.

Only if you are a non-EU citizen register for the preliminary selection

Only if you are a non-EU citizen should you register for the pre-selection process by submitting your application on the **QS MoveIn** platform by the deadlines indicated at the following link: <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/admissions>. If you pass the pre-selection process, accept the course offer on the platform and download the pre-acceptance letter. **Note: No agency is authorized to provide pre-acceptance letters. The letter can only be downloaded by applicants through the MoveIn platform.** A fee of **30,00 euros** is required, which is separate from the subsequent payment of 10,00 euros for access to the ranking list. The deadline for non-EU citizens residing abroad who require a student visa is **May 15, 2026**.

Only if you are a non-EU citizen apply for a visa

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country and reside abroad, log in to the [University platform](#) to apply for a student visa, and complete and submit your application by June 30, 2026.

Please note: SPID or CIE credentials are required for registration (only for Italian citizens).
Once you've completed the process, you will receive your student ID number.

Pay the 10,00-euro fee for the selection process

Enter the program code 14824
Click "Continue" and then "Next"
Click on "Direct Payment via PagoPa".
Pay close attention to the payment deadlines.

Check the rankings

The rankings will be published on the page <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/restricted-access-degree-programmes-tolc-i-and-selections> based on the scores obtained on the test, in accordance with the criteria and dates specified in this announcement.

Pay the enrolment fees

If you are successful in the ranking of a selection, you must pay the enrolment fees by the deadlines specified in this call for applications. If you are admitted but do not pay the enrolment fees by the deadlines in the call for applications, you will not be able to enrol in the program.
Please note! If you are a tax resident in Italy and wish to pay a reduced fee, you must calculate your [ISEE 2026](#) in advance to qualify for university tuition assistance. You can contact a CAF or visit the [INPS website](#).
If you are a tax resident abroad, you will pay a fixed amount ([point 8](#)).

1. Admission to the programme

To access the restricted access degree in Applied Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence, you must:

- only if you are a non-EU citizen, reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, register for the pre-selection process on MoveIn <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/admissions>
- have taken one of the following tests **by the specified deadlines**:
 - TOLC-I ([point 3.1](#) and [Annex 1](#)), for EU and non-EU equivalent applicants
 - TOLC-S ([point 3.1](#) and [Annex 1](#)), for EU and non-EU equivalent applicants
 - English TOLC-I ([point 3.1](#) and [Annex 1](#)), for EU, non-EU equivalent and non-EU applicants
 - CEnT-S ([point 3.1](#) and [Annex 1](#)), for EU, non-EU equivalent and non-EU applicants
 - SAT General Test ([point 3.2](#) and [Annex 1](#)), for EU, non-EU equivalent and non-EU applicants
- register for one of the scheduled selection ([point 3](#))
- pay the degree programme enrolment fees by the specified deadlines ([point 7](#) and [point 8](#)).

Please note

You must use the same email address for all the platforms involved in the procedure:

- MoveIn, for pre-selection;
- CISIA or College Board, for taking the entrance exam
- Infostud, for paying fees due to the University

Please ensure the email address provided is correct and check your inbox regularly.

All dates and times in this document refer to Central European Time (Rome, Italy)

2. Requirements for participating in the selection process

2.1 - For applicants who are Italian citizens, citizens of another EU country, or citizens of a non-EU country with a valid residence permit in Italy (non-EU equivalents)

If you are a citizen of:

- Italy;
- an EU country other than Italy;
- a non-EU country and hold a valid residence permit in Italy (Article 26 of Law No. 189/2002)

to be eligible to apply, you must meet the following requirements:

- **upper secondary school diploma** already obtained or to be obtained in 2026.
If you hold a qualification obtained within a foreign secondary education system, you must carefully read the list of required documents on the Sapienza website [Go to the page](#);
 - **have taken one of the following tests** by the deadlines set for each selection process ([point 7](#)):
 - TOLC-I** taken from 1 July 2024
 - TOLC-S** taken from 1 July 2024
 - English TOLC-I** from 1 July 2024 to November 2025
 - CEnT-S** taken from November 2025, **in the sections M - Mathematics, R - Reasoning on text and data and P – Physics**all administered by the CISIA consortium <https://www.cisiaonline.it/en>
- or
- **SAT General Test** taken from 1 January 2024, administered by the **College Board** (<https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/>).
 - **English language proficiency of at least B2 level** ([Annex 2](#)).

2.2 - For applicants who are citizens of a non-EU country and are applying for a student visa

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country (or if you are a Chinese citizen and have applied for pre-enrolment in the “Marco Polo” programme at Sapienza for the 2025/2026 academic year), you are resident abroad and need to apply for an entry student visa, **you may only participate in the first selection round** and must meet the following requirements:

- **upper secondary school diploma** obtained or to be obtained in 2026 with a GPA of no less than 75/100.
If you hold a qualification obtained within a foreign secondary education system, you must carefully read the list of documents required for enrolment as indicated on the Sapienza website [Go to page](#).
- **have taken one of the following tests** by the deadlines set for each selection round ([point 7](#)):
English TOLC-I from 1 July 2024 to November 2025
CENT-S taken from November 2025 onwards, **in the sections M - Mathematics, R - Reasoning on text and data, P – Physics**
all administered by the CISIA consortium <https://www.cisiaonline.it/en>

or

SAT General Test taken from 1 January 2024, administered by the **College Board** (<https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/>).

- **Letter of pre-acceptance** to the degree programme in Applied Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence, downloaded in .pdf format following a successful outcome of the pre-selection process carried out as indicated at <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/admissions>.
The letter of pre-acceptance must be downloaded from the [MoveIN](#) platform no later than the deadlines set for the selection process.

Please note

You can register for the pre-selection process by 15 May 2026 (if you are a non-EU citizen and require a visa).

You will not be admitted to the degree programme if:

- You do not receive the pre-acceptance letter via the MoveIn platform;
- You receive the pre-acceptance letter but do not accept the offer;
- You receive the pre-acceptance letter, accept the offer but do not pass the subsequent selection stage.

- **online pre-enrolment application** to obtain a student entry visa under the “University Enrolment” category for the 2026–2027 academic year, via the University website (<https://www.universitaly.it/>) which must be completed and submitted by 30 June 2026. Pre-registration on the University website is mandatory to obtain an entry visa for study purposes.
Please note: pre-registration alone does not guarantee admission to the degree programme. To enrol, you must follow the procedures set out in this call for applications.

- **knowledge of English at least at B2 level** (to be certified as indicated in [Annex 2](#)).

3. Selection process

To take part in the selection process, you must:

- have taken one of the following admission tests:
TOLC-I, for EU and equivalent non-EU students

TOLC-S, for EU and equivalent non-EU students

English TOLC-I, for EU, equivalent non-EU and non-EU students

CEnT-S, for EU, equivalent non-EU and non-EU students

SAT, for EU, equivalent non-EU and non-EU students

by the dates indicated in the table below;

- register with Infostud ([point 3.3](#));
- pay the fee of € 10,00 ([point 3.4](#)) by the deadlines indicated below
- attend an online interview, if requested by the examination board

Taking the test, registering for Sapienza services, paying the fee and accepting the letter of pre-acceptance (the latter only if you are a non-EU citizen and require a visa) must be completed by the deadlines set for each individual selection round, failing which you will be excluded from the ranking list.

There are two selection rounds for EU and equivalent non-EU citizens and a single selection round for non-EU citizens.

Any places not filled in the first EU selection round will be made available for the subsequent EU selection round.

Please note

- If you take the test by the deadline for registering for the selection process but do not pay the € 10,00 fee by the specified deadline, **you will not be able to take part in the selection process.**
- If you pay the € 10,00 fee by the deadline for registering for the selection process but do not take the test by the specified deadline, **you will not be able to take part in the selection process.**
- **If you are an EU citizen and wish to take part in both selection processes**, you must pay the €10,00 fee each time by the deadlines specified for each selection process.

3.1 - Registration for the TOLC or CEnT-S

If you choose to take the TOLC-I, TOLC-S or CEnT-S, you must visit the CISIA consortium website at <https://www.cisiaonline.it/en>, where you will also find information on how to register and the exam schedule.

You can register for exams organised by Sapienza or by any other university listed in the CISIA calendar.

Please note

- **The tax code** you enter on the Cisia website when registering for the TOLC or CEnT-S must match the one you provide when registering with Infostud ([point 3.3](#)) otherwise, it will not be possible to record your test score.

Any TOLC or CEnT-S tests taken after the deadline specified in [point 3](#), even if organised by Sapienza University of Rome, are not valid for participation in the selection process for this call for applications.

Registration closes at 2.00 pm, approximately one week before the scheduled test date.

If you take the test more than once, the highest score achieved will be taken into account for the purposes of the ranking.

3.2 - Registration for the SAT

If you choose to take the SAT (see [Annex 1](#) point A1.2) you must visit the website <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/>, where you will also find information on how to register and the **test schedule**.

The SAT can be taken at any SAT Centre worldwide.

Your SAT score must be sent to Sapienza via the College Board portal

SAT scores must be received by the University within the deadlines for participating in the selection process ([point 3](#)). We therefore recommend that you carefully check the deadlines for submitting SAT scores on the College Board website: <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/>:

3.3 - Registration on Infostud

To register with Infostud, you will need to enter your details in the form available on the Sapienza website, under the 'Register' section <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina-strutturale/students>.

If you are an **Italian** citizen, you will need your SPID or CIE credentials.

Please note

The email address you provide during registration will be used for any communications from the University, so please check your email inbox regularly throughout the process.

If you already have an Infostud account, you must verify/enter your email address on the Idm dashboard by logging in with your SPID or CIE credentials, or with your student ID number and password, via the link <https://idm.uniroma1.it/>

3.4 - Payment of the € 10,00 selection fee

To pay the € 10,00 fee:

- Log in to Infostud <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina-strutturale/students> using your SPID or CIE credentials (if you are a foreign national, you will need to use your student ID number and password);
- click on “Degree programmes”;
- go to “Degree programme access”;
- enter the code **14824**;
- click on Continue and then Next;
- click on Direct payment (PagoPA).

The fee must be paid by **direct payment** (online, by credit card).

The € 10,00 fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.

3.5 - Disabilities or Specific Learning Disabilities (SLD)

Guidelines for those with a certified disability or a diagnosis of a specific learning disorder are set out in the [Annex 4](#).

4. Available Places

For the 2026–2027 academic year, the places available for admission to the degree programme are allocated as follows:

First selection round	60	60 of which 5 are reserved for the “Marco Polo” project (Note 3)
Second selection round	60 + any places not filled in the previous selection round	No places

Note 1 - Places reserved for Italian nationals, nationals of other EU countries, and nationals of non-EU countries who hold a valid residence permit in Italy (Article 26 of Law No. 189/2002 – Annex 3 [point A3.1](#)).

Note 2 - Places reserved for those who are citizens of a non-EU country, are permanently resident abroad and require an entry visa for study purposes (Annex 3 [point A3.3](#)).

Note 3 – Places reserved for Chinese citizens participating in the “Marco Polo” project for Sapienza (Annex 3 [point A3.4](#)).

If the number of enrolled students who are citizens of non-EU countries (Note 2) is lower than the number of places available, the remaining places will be made available to those holding the citizenship specified in Note 1.

The number of EU places actually available in the second selection round will be published at the link <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/restricted-access-degree-programmes-tolc-i-and-selections> on the dates indicated in the procedure calendar ([point 7](#)).

5. Rankings

Once the application period has closed, those who have taken part in the selection process will be placed in descending order on a list drawn up on the basis of the score obtained in the test and converted.

Please note

For the purposes of participating in the selection process and inclusion on the ranking list, Sapienza will take into account the unnormalised CEnT-S score.

Anyone who identifies any inconsistencies must report them in accordance with the procedures and within the deadlines set out in [point 7](#).

The assessment panel reserves the right to invite candidates to a **possible interview** to assess their individual knowledge. All information regarding the interview will be sent by email to the selected candidates.

The interview may result in a decision to admit the candidate for enrolment or a decision not to admit them, which will result in the loss of all rights to enrolment regardless of the score obtained in the test. Places that become available due to a decision of non-admission will be allocated to those occupying the subsequent positions in descending order of the score achieved, until all available places are filled.

The rankings are expressed in hundredths and structured in descending order of score, based on the criteria set out in [Annex 1](#).

The date of publication of the rankings for each selection is indicated in the calendar of procedures referred to in [point 7](#).

The rankings are published by student number on the page <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/restricted-access-degree-programmes-tolc-i-and-selections> and by name at the Faculty's Student Affairs Office.

In the event of a tie, the candidate who is younger in age shall be given priority.

For those who have taken the admission test on multiple occasions (from the dates indicated in this call for applications and within the deadlines set for the selection rounds), **the highest score obtained shall be taken into account.**

The minimum score required for admission to the degree programme is **36/100**.

6. Conditions for enrolment on the degree programme

Please note

You must comply with all the conditions and deadlines set out, otherwise you will not be able to enrol on the degree programme.

If you took part in the first selection round, you must:

- achieve a score of **36/100** or higher in the admission test ([point 5](#)) and pass any admission interview

- be ranked within the limit of available places;
- certify your knowledge of English as described in [Annex 2](#)
- pay the first instalment of the degree programme enrolment fees by the deadlines indicated in [point 7](#) and in the manner specified in [point 8](#).

If you took part in the second selection round (only if you are an EU or equivalent non-EU citizen), you must:

- achieve a score of **36/100** or higher in the admission test ([point 5](#)) and pass any admission interview
- be ranked within the limit of available places;
- certify your knowledge of English as described in [Annex 2](#)
- pay the first instalment of the degree programme enrolment fees by the deadlines indicated in [point 7](#) and in accordance with the procedures set out in [point 8](#).

If you have obtained a score lower than **40/100**, after enrolment and within the first year of the degree programme you will be required to complete the Further Required Courses (OFAs) ([point 10](#)).

Please note

If you do not pay the degree programme enrolment fees by the dates indicated in [point 7](#) you will lose your place on the ranking list, which will be made available for subsequent ranking lists.

8. Enrolment

Final enrolment is confirmed upon payment of the first instalment of the degree programme fees for the 2026–2027 academic year, plus a stamp duty of € 16,00 and the regional tax. Instructions for payment can be found at the following link <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/restricted-access-degree-programmes-tolc-i-and-selections> under the heading “Enrolment”.

The code to enter is: **33502**

If you have taken part in the selection process but do not pay the degree programme enrolment fees by the deadline specified in [point 7](#) **you will lose your place on the ranking list**, which will be made available to subsequent candidates according to the merit ranking.

During the procedure, you may specify any conditions for exemption from enrolment fees and the regional tax. The € 16,00 stamp duty is payable in all cases.

It is extremely important at this stage to have obtained the **ISEE 2026 calculation for the right to university education** in order to benefit from the exemptions and concessions provided for on the basis of this indicator ([Annex 5](#)).

Those who are not required to pay any university enrolment fee may proceed with enrolment by paying only the € 16,00 stamp duty.

If you are successful in the ranking and hold a qualification from a foreign secondary education system, you must follow the instructions on the Sapienza website to enrol by the relevant deadlines [Go to page](#).

8.2 - For applicants transferring from another Sapienza degree programme

If you are successful in the ranking, are currently enrolled on another Sapienza degree programme, and wish to apply for credit for exams taken on your previous degree programme, you must follow the instructions provided on the Sapienza website. [Go to the page](#)

The transfer application must be sent by email no later than the deadline for payment of the degree programme enrolment fees specified in [point 7](#) with both the administrative office of your current degree programme and the administrative office of the degree programme you wish to enrol in listed as recipients (see [point 12](#)).

In the email addressed to the secretariats, you must state your position on the ranking list and confirm that this position falls within the limit of places specified in the call for applications.

Please note: once you have submitted your transfer application, you will not be able to take exams for your original degree programme.

8.3 - For applicants transferring from another Italian university

If you are successful in the ranking, are currently enrolled on a degree programme at another Italian university, and wish to apply for recognition of the exams you have taken on your previous degree programme, you must pay the enrolment fee for your chosen new degree programme by the deadlines specified in [point 7](#). Within ten days of paying the fees, you must submit a transfer application. [Follow the instructions](#)

Please note: once you have paid the transfer fee, you will no longer be able to take exams for your previous degree programme.

8.4 - For applicants holding an Italian university qualification

If you are successful in the ranking, already hold a degree from Sapienza or another Italian university, and wish to apply for the recognition of university credits earned during your previous studies, you must submit your application **within 15 calendar days of paying the first instalment of the degree programme fees**, following the instructions on the Sapienza website. If you obtained your degree from a university other than Sapienza, you must also attach a self-certification of your qualification, including details of the exams, corresponding grades, Scientific Disciplinary Sectors (SSD) and credits.

Your application will be assessed by the relevant faculty bodies.

8.5 - For applicants holding a qualification from a foreign university system

9. Withdrawal from enrolment

If, after paying the first instalment, you wish to withdraw from the programme, you must follow this procedure:

For those who are citizens of a non-EU country, hold a residence permit for study purposes and decide not to enrol

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country and, having entered on a student visa, hold a residence permit for study purposes, by withdrawing your enrolment at Sapienza or other universities **you will no longer meet the requirements for residence in Italy and therefore your residence permit for study purposes will be revoked**. To enrol again, you will need to return to your country of origin and complete the pre-selection procedures on the QS MoveIn platform by 15 May 2026 (link: <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/admissions>) and the pre-enrolment procedures via the UniversItaly online platform (<https://www.universitaly.it/>) by 30 June 2026 at the latest.

10. Further Required Courses (OFAs)

Further Required Courses (OFAs) in **Mathematics** are assigned if you have paid the course enrolment fees, have been placed on the waiting list, and have obtained a score **lower than 40/100**, as specified in [Annex 1](#).

Further Required Courses (OFAs) must be fulfilled within the **first year of the degree programme** in one of the following two ways:

- by passing the OFA **remedial test** offered by the I3S Faculty

or

- by passing the **curricular exam** in Linear Algebra (6 ECTS)

If you are required to complete the OFA, you will be notified by the I3S Student Guidance Office regarding tutoring activities and the OFA resit procedures. In particular, a Widespread Tutoring Service will be provided on topics from Analysis 1 and Geometry, organised as a dedicated space for group study and discussion with tutors regarding immediate queries and exercises, as well as an **OFA resit exam** which will take place **in person**.

You must pass the OFA within the first year of the programme. If you do not pass the OFA, you will not be able to take exams for years beyond the first, starting from the 2027–2028 academic year.

Annex 1. Admission test and test assessment

A1.1 - TOLC-I and TOLC-S

You can take the TOLC-I and TOLC-S if you are enrolled in the fourth or fifth year of upper secondary school or if you have already obtained a diploma. You can take the test at Sapienza or at any of the centres affiliated with CISIA. In the TOLC@CASA format, the test is taken at home.

Please note: The English TOLC-I taken between 1 July 2024 and November 2025 is also considered valid.

Please note: registration closes at 14:00, approximately one week before the scheduled test date.

You may take each type of TOLC, regardless of the test format, **no more than once per calendar month**, irrespective of the selected organising university.

The **TOLC-I** (including the TOLC@CASA format) consists of **50 questions** divided into **4 sections**. For the purposes of inclusion in the ranking for participation in Sapienza's selection process, the sections are: **Mathematics, Logic, Science, Verbal Comprehension** (TOLC-I). The number of questions and the time allocated for each section are shown in the table below.

The **TOLC-S** (including the TOLC@CASA format) consists of **55 questions divided into 6 sections**. For the purposes of inclusion in the Sapienza selection ranking, the score achieved in the sections on **Basic Mathematics; Reasoning, problem-solving and reading comprehension; Biology; Chemistry; Physics; Earth Sciences (in order of priority)** will be taken into account.

The TOLC result is determined by the number of correct, incorrect and unanswered questions, which together determine a total score, calculated as follows:

- 1 point for each correct answer
- 0 points for each unanswered question
- - 0.25 points for each incorrect answer.

The minimum score is -12.5 for the TOLC-I and -13.75 for the TOLC-S.

The **TOLC-I in Italian** and the **TOLC-S in Italian** include an additional **English** section. The number of questions and the time allowed are detailed in the table below.

In the English language test, there is no penalty for incorrect answers, and the score is determined by awarding

- 1 point for correct answers and
- 0 points for incorrect or unanswered questions.

This score does not count towards the overall score required for participation in the selection process; however, it determines partial fulfilment of the English language proficiency requirement described in [Annex 2](#).

The score obtained in the in-person TOLC is available immediately after the test has finished, on the same terminal assigned for the test; it can be viewed and downloaded in the 'test results' section of the CISIA website, by accessing your 'test reserved area' using the credentials used to register on the portal.

The score obtained in the TOLC@CASA test, which can be viewed immediately on screen at the end of the test, will be recognised as official and made available, subject to checks for non-compliance with test procedures as set out in CISIA's "TOLC Participants" regulations, within 48 hours of the day following the test date.

If you have completed the test correctly, adhering to the rules and conduct set out in the regulations, your TOLC@CASA result will be recognised/validated and you will be able to access it within 48 hours of the day following the test.

Each type of TOLC (including the TOLC@CASA format) may be retaken multiple times in order to achieve a result at least above the required threshold or to avoid being assigned Further Required Courses (OFAs), **but no more than once a month.**

A1.2 – CenT-S

You can take the CEnT-S if you are enrolled in the fourth or fifth year of upper secondary school or if you have obtained a school leaving certificate.

CEnT-S tests are administered via a computerised platform in two modes: in specially equipped university classrooms (CEnT-S@UNI; in this case, participants must provide proof of payment and registration upon entering the classroom) or remotely, in virtual classrooms supervised by examination boards appointed by the universities organising the test (CEnT-S@CASA).

The CEnT-S test dates are spread across **4 main periods**:

FIRST MAIN PERIOD (November 2025 to January 2026)

SECOND MAIN PERIOD (February to March 2026)

THIRD MACRO-PERIOD (April to June 2026)

FOURTH MACRO-PERIOD (September to October 2026)

You may take a CEnT exam only once per macro-period for each type of CEnT, regardless of the booking location and the method of testing.

A1.2.1 - Structure of the CEnT-S

The structure of the CEnT-S – namely the sections it comprises, the number of questions in each section, the time allowed for each section, and the syllabus – is always kept up to date and available on the CISIA portal.

The questions are multiple-choice and offer five possible options, only one of which is correct.

The test is in English and is designed for courses taught in this language.

The structure of the CEnT-S for the 2025–2026 academic year comprises **5 sections, totalling 55 questions**:

- Mathematics: 15 questions (30 minutes)
- Reasoning on texts and data: 15 questions (30 minutes)
- Biology: 10 questions (20 minutes)
- Chemistry: 10 questions (20 minutes)
- Physics: 5 questions (10 minutes)

For the purposes of the selection process outlined in this call for applications, you will only be required to complete the following sections of the CEnT-S: M – Mathematics (15 questions), R – Reasoning on texts and data (15 questions), P – Physics (5 questions).

A1.2.2 - Assessment and results

At the end of the test, participants will immediately be able to view a summary of their performance in terms of the number of correct, incorrect and unanswered questions.

For the purposes of participation in the selection process of this call for application and inclusion in the ranking list, Sapienza will take into account the unstandardised score, determined by the number of correct, incorrect and unanswered answers, calculated as follows:

- 1 point for each correct answer;
- 0 points for each unanswered question;
- - 0.25 penalty points for each incorrect answer.

A1.3 - SAT

The SAT General Test (hereinafter referred to as the SAT) is a test used in the admissions processes of colleges and universities worldwide. Administered in English, the SAT comprises a **Reading Test**, a **Writing and Language Test**, and a **Maths Test**. It is administered by the **College Board**: further information, such as the test schedule, fees, test centres and deadlines, is available on the College Board website: <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/>. The number of questions and the time allowed for each section is shown in the table below.

The SAT Total Score achieved after taking the test summarises the results of the sections included. The score is reported on a scale of 400 to 1600 and combines the **Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score** and the **Math score** (each on a scale of 200–800). The score report provides further information based on additional sub-scores. The total score is required for the admissions process and determines the ranking lists.

For those who have taken the SAT **more than once** (from **January 2024** onwards and within the relevant selection deadlines), the **highest score achieved among those for which the College Board was requested to send to Sapienza within the deadlines indicated** in [point 7](#) will be considered for the purposes of compiling the ranking lists.

A1.4 - Methodological note and correlation between SAT, TOLC-I, English TOLC-I, TOLC-S and CEnT-S

In order to ensure the comparability of the results of the admission tests covered by this call for applications, a **single score** expressed in **hundredths** will be used. The conversion is based on the following formulas, with no scores below 0 permitted for the TOLC and no scores below 600 permitted for the SAT.

Considering

- T_{TOLC}^{\min} equal to 0
- T_{TOLC}^{\max} equal to the maximum score obtainable on the TOLC-I (50 points) or the TOLC-S (55 points), excluding the English section
- T_{TOLC} equal to the score achieved by the candidate in the TOLC-I or TOLC-S

the unified score is calculated as follows:

- T_{CEnT}^{\min} equal to 0
- T_{CEnT}^{\max} equal to the maximum score achievable in the CEnT-S (35 points)
- T_{CEnT} equal to the score achieved by the candidate via the CEnT-S

the standardised score is calculated as follows:

Annex 2. English language proficiency requirements

To take part in the selection process, you must have a command of English equivalent to at least level B2 according to the [Common European Framework of Reference for Languages \(CEFR\)](#). To demonstrate your proficiency in English, you must meet at least one of the following requirements.

- a) Provide **one of the following certificates** attesting to your attainment of B2-level English proficiency, including the home edition where applicable:
- **FCE** – First Certificate in English;
 - **IELTS** (academic)* with a minimum score of **5.5** out of **9**;
 - A valid **TOEFL iBT** * with a minimum score of **72** out of **120** (internet-based);
 - **CAE** – Certificate in Advanced English;
 - **CPE** – Certificate of Proficiency in English;
 - **PTE** – Pearson Test of English **General, Level 3 – B2** CEFR or higher (valid);
 - **PTE** – Pearson Test of English – **Academic** with a minimum score of **42**
- Including IELTS Academic Home-Based Test and TOEFL iBT Home Edition Test
- b) Provide evidence of holding:
- an **International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma**;
 - or a **degree awarded in English** by an accredited institution in the EU/EEA/Schengen area or in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States;
 - or a **General Certificate of Education (GCE)**.

Alternatively, you may:

- c) Have taken the **SAT**, the **English TOLC-I and CEnT-S**
- d) Achieve **at least 24/30 marks** in the **English section** of the **TOLC-I or TOLC-S in Italian** ([Annex 1](#)).

Applicants who are citizens of a non-EU country and are applying for a student visa must upload the required documentation to the Moveln platform by the deadlines set for pre-acceptance.

Those holding Italian citizenship, citizenship of another EU country, or citizenship of a non-EU country with a valid residence permit in Italy (non-EU equivalents) must send the documents indicated in points (a) and (b) to the email address acsai@di.uniroma1.it

The documents must be sent by the deadline set for payment of the degree programme enrolment fee ([point 7](#)).

The subject line of the email must be in the following format: “ACSAI - Knowledge of English: Certificate” followed by the student ID number received during registration ([point 3.3](#)).

In the body of the message, you must specify:

first name and surname, student ID number, type of English language proficiency test taken, date of completion, and score (if applicable). The certificate must be in PDF format, a true copy of the original, and must include your details and the result obtained. A mere confirmation of having taken the test is not sufficient.

Annex 3. Citizenship in foreign countries and/or qualifications obtained in a foreign education system

A3.1 - Citizenship in EU and non-EU countries with a residence permit in Italy (non-EU nationals treated as equivalent)

Follow the general procedures set out in the call for applications if:

- you are a citizen of one of the European Union countries or one of the following countries: Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Switzerland, the Republic of San Marino, the Vatican City State;
- you hold dual citizenship, one of which is in a European Union country;
- you are a citizen of a non-EU country, but hold one of the following residence permits issued by the Italian State:
 - o EU long-term residence permit;
 - o Residence permit for employment or self-employment;
 - o Residence permit for family reasons;
 - o Residence permit for political asylum, subsidiary protection or special reasons;
 - o Residence permit for religious reasons;
 - o Residence card under Article 50 TEU – Article 18.4 of the EU-UK Withdrawal Agreement
- you are a non-EU citizen but have been legally resident in Italy for at least one year and hold a upper secondary school qualification obtained in Italy that grants access to your chosen degree programme, or you hold a degree or an accredited Foundation Year certificate obtained at an Italian university, duly recognised by the Ministry of Education, Universities and Research (MUR), in the 2025/2026 academic year;
- you are a citizen of a non-EU country and are duly enrolled on a degree programme at an Italian university, hold a valid residence permit for study purposes and intend to apply for a transfer or progression to years following your initial enrolment;
- you are a non-EU citizen and you (or one of your parents or your spouse) are a member of staff serving in foreign diplomatic missions and international organisations based in Italy, accredited to the Italian State or the Holy See. In this case, you must submit your residence permit for diplomatic purposes.

If you hold a residence permit for study in Italy issued for

- attending an Italian language course
- undertaking an exchange/mobility period
- attending a “single course”

follow the instructions provided at [point A3.3](#)

A3.2 - Dual citizenship

If you hold dual citizenship, one of which is Italian or from another EU country, your Italian citizenship or that of the other EU country takes precedence (Law No. 218 of 31 May 1995, Article 19, paragraph 2) and therefore, to enrol on the degree programme indicated in this call for applications, you must follow the instructions provided for those who hold citizenship of an EU country and a non-EU country and hold a valid residence permit in Italy (non-EU citizens treated as equivalent).

A3.3 - Citizenship in non-EU countries, residence abroad and application for a student visa

If you are a non-EU citizen, reside in a country other than Italy and do not meet the requirements set out in [point A3.1](#), you must apply for an entry visa for study purposes, as indicated in [point 2.2](#), in order to enrol on the degree programme specified in this call for applications.

If you are a non-EU citizen and hold a residence permit for study purposes in Italy issued to attend an Italian

language course or to undertake an exchange/mobility programme, in order to enrol on the degree programme covered by this call for applications, you must return to your country of origin and submit an application for an entry visa for study purposes as indicated in [point 2.2](#).

A residence permit for study purposes issued for a “single course” will be considered valid for university enrolment as an EU equivalent only if all three of the following requirements are met in the 2025/2026 academic year:

- You entered the country on a study visa issued specifically for single courses
- You have regularly attended the single course and passed the relevant exam
- The single course attended is relevant to the degree programme chosen for your subsequent academic career

If even one of the listed requirements is not met, in order to enrol on the degree programme of this call for applications, you must return to your country of origin and submit an application for an entry visa for study purposes as indicated at [point 2.2](#).

Once the necessary checks on the foreign qualifications submitted have been completed, the application will be forwarded by the Hello - International Student Office to the relevant student office for the administrative process.

The application will be assessed by the academic departments.

Annex 4. Disabilities and Specific Learning Disorders

A4.1 - Recognised disability/disability (TOLC and CEnT, including @home mode)

If you have a recognised disability under Article 3, paragraph 1 or 3 of Law No. 104 of 5 February 1992, or a disability certificate, and require special aids or additional time to take the CISIA tests (TOLC and CEnT), you must declare your condition **when registering on the CISIA portal**.

In such cases, the following is allowed:

- additional time of up to 50% more than that specified for the TOLC/CEnT
- depending on the certification provided, for taking the TOLC/CEnT, assistance from a tutor for writing and/or reading, an Italian Sign Language (L.I.S.) interpreter, a basic calculator, and an accessible desk (only for tests taken in university lecture rooms)

If you select Sapienza as the venue where you intend to take the TOLC/CEnT, you must upload the necessary certificates and documentation to prove your disability status through a special document upload form provided by CISIA, which will forward the documentation to Sapienza.

Requests must be received no later than the TOLC/CEnT registration deadline and must be accompanied by appropriate certification issued by INPS or the relevant National Health Service (S.S.N.) bodies. You can check the allocation of support measures on the TOLC delivery platform.

A4.2 - Specific learning disorders – SLD (TOLC and CEnT, including home-based mode)

If you have been diagnosed with a specific learning disorders (SLD), as defined by Law No. 170/2010 and Ministerial Decree No. 5669/2011, and require specific aids for taking the TOLC/CEnT exam due to the nature of your SLD, **you must declare your condition** when registering on the CISIA portal.

In this case, the following is allowed:

- 30% extra time in addition to the time allocated for the TOLC/CEnT;
- the use of a basic non-scientific calculator, subject to the certification provided.

If you indicate Sapienza as the venue where you intend to take the TOLC/CEnT, you must upload the necessary certificates and documentation to prove your SLD status through a special document upload form provided by CISIA, which will forward the documentation to Sapienza.

Applications must be received no later than the TOLC/CEnT registration deadline and must be accompanied by appropriate SLD certification issued by NHS facilities or by specialists and facilities accredited by the NHS. You can check the allocation of support measures within the TOLC/CEnT delivery platform.

If the attached documents do not specify the accreditation of the facilities **or specialists** who issued the certification, you must add a note confirming this accreditation.

The SLD certification must be detailed and clear, referring to the nosographic codes and explicitly stating the SLD (reading and/or writing and/or numeracy).

The diagnosis must have been issued no more than three years ago if it relates to minors.

A4.3 - Recognised disability/invalidity and SLD (SAT)

If you have a documented disability or a diagnosis of a specific learning disorder (SLD), you are entitled to specific aids and compensatory measures during the SAT test. Some of the aids available include: extended time, extra and extended breaks, and reading and visual aids. These aids must be approved by the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (<https://accommodations.collegeboard.org/>).

Approval may take several weeks. You should therefore start the process of submitting your application well in advance. Further information is available at <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/register/special-circumstances/students-with-disabilities>.

A4.4 - Disability/invalidity and SLD for students residing abroad

If you have a recognised disability or a diagnosis of a learning disability and are resident in a foreign country, and you wish to take advantage of the benefits outlined above, you must submit a certificate confirming your disability or learning disability issued in your country of residence, accompanied by a certified translation into Italian or English.

Annex 5. ISEE

The ISEE (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) for the right to university education is required to obtain a reduction in tuition fees (the lower the ISEE value, the lower the amount to be paid).

The calculation of the ISEE for the right to university education must be requested from the Tax Assistance Centers (CAF) after January 15, 2026, and at least 30 days before the applicable deadlines ([point 7](#)).

For those who have a PIN code or SPID digital identity (a unique code for accessing all digital and online services of the Public Administration), it is also possible to request the 2026 ISEE calculation directly online by submitting the DSU (Single Substitute Declaration) on the INPS website (<https://www.inps.it/it/en.html>).

For those with foreign citizenship and/or who report income earned abroad and therefore cannot provide ISEE certification, a fixed-amount registration fee applies, based on the country of origin.
