Dear Professor Saurer,

You have applied to the CIVIS Hub 1 on Climate, Environment and Energy in its call for proposals that closed on October 18 2021.

We are pleased to inform you that your application has been selected by the Hub 1 Council and approved by CIVIS Steering Committee on December 16.

The following CIVIS funding is allocated to your project:

- 15 student mobility scholarships (excluding students from the host university) corresponding to € 7 095.
- € 3 120 for 3 academic staff mobilities (excluding academics from the host university and guest lecturers. The latter cannot be financed via the CIVIS budget, unfortunately)

Please note that this document should be sent as soon as possible – at least two months before the activities take place – to ensure smooth implementation of the administrative procedures.


