1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the degree programme, it is necessary to:

- Pay the €10 fee following the methods and deadlines laid down in paragraph 3. a.
- b. Wait for the result of the entry requirements assessment. If the requirements are not met, missing credits (ECTS) can be acquired by passing single courses. Methods and costs are laid down in Article 41 of the Student Regulations. Go to the page
- Carry out the academic knowledge assessment in compliance with the C. procedures laid down in paragraph 4.
- d. **Proceed to enrolment** by paying the degree programme tuition fees following the procedures and deadlines indicated in paragraph 5. Enrolment can be carried out only after the Student Affairs Office sends the email informing about the successful result of the entry requirements and academic knowledge assessment.

Candidates coming from other Italian universities

Before carrying out the payment, candidates coming from other Italian universities must register following the procedure described on the page

https://cybersecurity.uniroma1.it/admission and send to the email address of the programme's educational affairs office (segr.didattica@di.uniroma1.it) within the same application deadlines for the entry requirements assessment, the digitalised documents listed below:

- Curriculum Vitae (in the Europass format);

- Self-declaration of the educational qualification obtained specifying the exams taken and the scientific-disciplinary sectors corresponding to the subjects (a form is available on the page: https://cybersecurity.uniroma1.it/admission);

- Official B2 level English language certificate (or a self-declaration, whose form is available on the page: https://cybersecurity.uniroma1.it/admission);

- A copy of the €10 payment receipt;

- A copy of a valid ID document.

Failure to submit the self-declaration of the study plan previously carried out or an unsuccessful result in the entry requirements assessment precludes enrolment in that specific degree programme.

Graduand candidates

If the Programme Regulations allow it, students from Sapienza University of Rome or from other Italian universities who have not graduated yet can also apply for the entry requirements assessment, subject to the obligation to gain their degree by January 14, 2023 (for Sapienza University of Rome graduands) and by December 17, 2022 (for graduands coming from other Italian or international universities).

Candidates coming from foreign countries

Procedures for international candidates are indicated in paragraph 6.

2. Admission requirements

To be admitted, candidates must meet the following requirements:

(a) Three-year bachelor's degree or academic diploma, or another international educational qualification, deemed appropriate:

3. Entry requirements assessment

The entry requirements assessment is requested by paying a $\in 10$ fee within one of the following dates, chosen by the student:

- September 15, 2022 (only date available for non-EU students applying for a student visa)
- October 13, 2022
- November 15, 2022
- December 15, 2022

January 17, 2023 (date available only for Sapienza University of Rome graduands and graduates).

The payment is generated on the Infostud system. The payment must be made online with PagoPA (direct payment). The code to insert on the system is 29389. Read the instructions

The result of the entry requirements assessment will be given on the candidate's institutional email address (if activated) or on the candidate's personal email address given on Infostud.

4. Academic knowledge assessment

The academic knowledge assessment is carried out if the entry requirements are met. For admission, students must submit to the educational affairs office, within the same application deadline for the entry requirements assessment, the following documents:

Curriculum vitae, a self-declaration of the educational qualification obtained, specifying the exams taken and the scientific-disciplinary sectors corresponding to the subjects, a copy of the payment receipt for the entry requirements assessment, a copy of a valid ID document, English language certificate.

The documents required can be sent as email attachments to the educational affairs office of the Cybersecurity master's degree at the email address: <u>segr.didattica@di.uniroma1.it</u> The educational affairs office - segr.didattica@di.uniroma1.it - will provide feedback on the emails received in August and September after the professors have assessed the documents attached.

An evaluation committee appointed by the Degree Programme Board will assess the academic knowledge based on the following elements:

- pertinence of the bachelor's degree study plan;
- other extra-curricular activities, including professional activities and other educational activities;
- B2 level English language proficiency;
- interview;
- remote interview.

5. Enrolment

Enrolment is carried out by paying the programme's enrolment tuition fees after completing the entry requirements and academic knowledge assessment with a successful result.

The payment is generated on the Infostud system.

6. Candidates with an international educational qualification

Procedures vary according to the citizenship and country of residence of candidates.

Candidates with non-EU citizenship residing abroad and applying for an entry visa and Chinese students in the Marco Polo project
