

The EU's Institutions



HIGH REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE UNION IN FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND SECURITY POLICY

Chairs the council of foreign ministers and is also vice president of the European Commission. Has own diplomatic service.

PRESIDENT OF THE EUROPEAN COUNCIL

Elected for two-and-a-half years.

EUROPEAN COUNCIL

Heads of state or government of member states set the EU's political goals.

appoints the EU's "foreign minister"

EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT


Directly elected parliament which is on an almost equal footing with the Council of Ministers regarding EU legislation.




Ministers of the member states. Creates legislation and determines EU policies. Most decisions are made on

a "double majority" basis (i.e. a minimum of 55 percent of member states representing a minimum of 65 percent of the EU's population)

chooses Commission president






The EU's "government." The Commission's president is elected by the European Parliament.
