Admission methods for the Master's Degree with entry requirements and academic knowledge assessment in:

Finance and insurance

Faculty of Economics

Stages of the procedure

For admission to the master's degree, it is required to:

- a. **Pay** the €10,00 fee in compliance with the methods and deadlines indicated in section 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the entry requirements assessment. **If the requirements are not met,** it is possible to acquire the missing credits by passing single exams. The methods and costs are set out in "Single Courses" of the Student Regulations Go to the Student Regulations
- c. Carry out the academic knowledge assessment in the modalities indicated in section 4.
- d. Proceed to enrolment by paying the master's degree enrolment tuition fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines indicated in section 5. Enrolment can only take place when the Student Affairs Office sends an email notification of the successful outcome of entry requirements and academic knowledge assessment.

Candidates from other Italian universities

After paying the €10,00 fee, candidates from other Italian universities must send to the student affairs office (using the form accessible at the link https://forms.gle/wXoP6FAC5xSPVtgw8):

- self-certification of the educational qualification obtained with indication of the graduation grade and degree Class;
- self-certification of the exams taken, the number of ECTS for each exam, the Scientific-Disciplinary Sectors corresponding to the subjects;
- a copy of the payment of the € 10.00 fee.

Candidates who have not graduated yet

Candidates who have not yet graduated (from Sapienza University of Rome or other universities) may also apply for entry requirements assessment, without prejudice to the obligation to graduate by January 24, 2026 (for those who have not yet graduated from Sapienza University of Rome) and by December 20, 2025 (for those who have not yet graduated from other Italian and international universities).

Requirements will be assessed only after the degree has been obtained.

For this purpose, candidates from other universities must submit the self-certifications referred to in the previous paragraph, including their final grade and degree class.

For candidates coming from foreign countries and/or in possession of a qualification obtained in a non-Italian education system

Procedures for candidates coming from foreign countries are indicated in section 6.

2. Entry requirements

In order to enrol in the Degree Programme in Finance, you must satisfy one of the following conditions:

I) hold a degree in the degree class L-18 or L-33 or in the corresponding classes activated pursuant to Ministerial Decree no. 509 of November 3, 1999;

II) for applicants who have graduated in other classes, possession of at least 72 ECTS acquired in the following foundation and core Scientific-Disciplinary Sectors (SSDs) envisaged in the tables attached to the Ministerial Decree December 19, 2024, for classes 18 and 33, in compliance with the minimum distribution constraints established by the Programme regulations between the subject areas ((at least three subject areas covered minimum coverage and completion of at least 18 ECTS in the statistical-mathematical area):

3. Entry requirements assessment

The assessment of entry requirements is requested by paying a fee of €10,00 from July 2, 2025, to one of the following dates of your choice:

- September 16, 2025 (only date available for non-EU candidates who request a student visa)
- October 16, 2025
- November 18, 2025
- December 16, 2025
- January 15, 2026 (date reserved for those who have already graduated or are about to graduate from Sapienza University of Rome).

Payment is generated on the Infostud system.

Payment is made online via PagoPA (direct payment).

The code to be entered in the system is 33439.

The outcome of the entry requirements assessment will be communicated to the institutional mailbox (if activated) or to the personal email address declared on Infostud.

4. Academic knowledge assessment

If the above-mentioned requirements are met, in order to enrol in the degree programme, students must also take a test aimed at assessing their academic knowledge.

Candidates who have completed a Bachelor's degree in classes 17 and 28 (ex Ministerial Decree 509/99) and L-18 and L-33 (ex Ministerial Decree 270/04) are exempt from undergoing the academic knowledge assessment test.

Candidates who hold a degree in other classes and have obtained a graduation grade no lower than 90/110 are also exempt from undergoing the academic knowledge assessment test.

For all the others, the Degree Programme Board will provide for assessment through an individual interview or group test or evaluation of the university career, with particular regard to the exams within the foundation and core Scientific-Disciplinary Sectors.

The assessment of academic knowledge will also concern English language proficiency of at least level B2 (assessment not necessary in the case of students holding a three-year degree entirely delivered in English).

5. Enrolment

Enrolment is obtained through payment of the enrolment tuition fees, after successful completion of the entry requirements and academic knowledge assessment.

Payment is generated on the Infostud system.

Payment is made online via PagoPA (direct payment).

The code to be entered in the system is 33439.

6. Candidates with an educational qualification obtained in a non-Italian education system

Procedures differ according to nationality and country of residence.

For those with citizenship in non-EU countries, residing abroad and applying for a study visa, and for those from China and participating in the Marco Polo project who choose the English language curriculum

In these cases, it is necessary to have the mandatory pre-acceptance letter.

The procedures to be followed are indicated in section 7 of the International Student Office page Read section 7

For those with non-EU citizenship, permanently residing abroad, who apply for a visa for study purposes that choose the Italian language curriculum they are not obliged to get the pre-acceptance letter but must pass the Italian language proficiency test (level B2), or must have an Italian language certificate of at least level B2, issued by recognised organisations (https://www.esteri.it/it/diplomazia-culturale-e-diplomazia-

<u>scientifica/cultura/promozionelinguaitaliana/certificazioni-linguistiche</u>) as indicated in the Ministry of University and Research Circular.

Enrolment procedures for those with an educational qualification from a non-Italian education system

Following the successful outcome of the entry requirements assessment, or upon receipt of the pre-acceptance letter, those in possession of an educational qualification obtained in a non-Italian education system must complete the enrolment procedure for the two-year Master's degree programme as indicated in section 4 of the International Student Office page Go to section 4
