Admission procedure for the Master's degree programme
with assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge in:

Management delle imprese Business Management

Faculty of Economics

1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.
The procedures and costs are set out in the section 'Single Examinations' of the Regulations for Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and for Student Fees

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- a. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities must, after paying the €10.00 fee, submit the following to the Student Affairs Office (using the dedicated form available at the link

<https://forms.gle/ekgxotrp9p3sybB66>

- a self-certification of the degree obtained, stating the final degree mark and the degree class;
- a self-certification of the examinations taken, the number of credits per examination, and the scientific-disciplinary sectors corresponding to the courses;
- a copy of the payment receipt for the €10.00 fee.

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to

the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

To enrol on the Master's Degree Programme in Economics and communication for management and innovation applicants must meet one of the following criteria:

- I) holding a Bachelor's degree in class L-18 or L-33, or in the corresponding classes established pursuant to Ministerial Decree No. 509 of 3 November 1999;
- II) for graduates in other classes, possession of at least 72 CFU acquired in the following SSDs as set out in the tables annexed to the Ministerial Decree of 19 December 2024 for class L-18 and 33, in compliance with the minimum distribution requirements established across the subject areas (minimum coverage of three of the four subject areas and the attainment of at least 18 CFU in the business subject area):

AGRI-01/A (formerly AGR/01); from ECON-01/A (formerly SECS-P/01) to ECON-10/A (formerly SECS-P/13); STEC-01/A (formerly SECS-P/04); STEC-01/B (formerly SECS-P/12); GIUR-01/A (formerly IUS/01); GIUR-02/A (formerly IUS/04); GIUR-03/A (formerly IUS/05); GIUR-02/B (formerly IUS/06); GIUR-04/A (formerly IUS/07); GIUR-05/A (formerly IUS/09); GIUR-06/A (formerly IUS/10); GIUR-08/A (formerly IUS/12); GIUR-09/A (formerly IUS/13); GIUR-10/A (formerly IUS/14); from STAT-01/A (formerly SECS-S/01) to STAT-04/A (formerly SECS-S/06); from MATH-01/A (formerly MAT/01) to MATH-06/A (formerly MAT/09); INFO-01/A (formerly INF/01); IIND/D-04/A (formerly ING-IND-16); IEGE-01/A (formerly ING-IND/35); from IINF-03/A (formerly ING-INF/03) to IINF-05/A (formerly ING-INF/05); GEOG-01/B (formerly M-GGR/02).

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2025 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The payment is generated via the Infostud system.

The **payment** is made online via PagoPA (direct payment).

The **code** to be entered into the system is **33447**.

The result of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

If you meet the entry requirements listed above, you must also take a non-selective test to assess your personal knowledge in order to enrol on the degree programme. The degree programme assesses personal knowledge through an individual interview or an evaluation of your academic record, with particular regard to examinations in the core subject areas and proficiency in English at least at CEF (Common European Framework) level B2. This requirement is met if you hold an official CEF certificate or have earned at least 3 ECTS credits in the form of an 'English language proficiency' qualification. Proficiency in English is also

deemed to be demonstrated in the case of: native English-speaking students; students holding a diploma or degree awarded in English from an accredited institution in the EU/EEA/Schengen area or in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States; students holding an International Baccalaureate (IB), GCSE or equivalent diplomas/certificates. In the absence of the qualifications or requirements listed above, students must take an interview to assess their knowledge of English. Students who have obtained a first-level degree in classes L-18 and L-33 under Ministerial Decree 270/04 and subsequent amendments and additions are exempt from taking the personal knowledge assessment test. (classes L-17 and L-28 pursuant to Ministerial Decree 509/99). Students holding a degree from other classes who have achieved a final mark of no less than 90/110 are also exempt from the personal knowledge assessment test.

To enrol on the English-language Management and Business Strategy programme, an adequate knowledge of the language of communication is also required, certified by one of the following language certificates: TOEFL iBT 80; TOEFL PBT 550; TOEIC (Listening/Reading 785; Speaking 160, Writing 150 – all 4 skills required); IELTS (Academic) 6.5.

The above certificates are not required in the case of:

- Native English speakers;
- Students holding a diploma or degree awarded in English from an accredited institution in the EU/EEA/Schengen area or in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States;
- Students holding an International Baccalaureate (IB), GCSE or equivalent diplomas/certificates.

5. Enrolment

6. For students who hold a qualification from a foreign education system

The procedures vary depending on citizenship and country of residence.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo programme who have chosen the English-language programme

In these cases, you must hold a mandatory letter of pre-acceptance.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo project who have chosen the Italian-language programme

In this case, a letter of pre-acceptance is not required, but you must **pass the Italian language proficiency test** (level B2), or submit a certificate of proficiency in Italian at a level

no lower than B2, as indicated in point 1 on the International Students' Office page. This requirement applies only to those applying for enrolment on a degree programme taught in Italian

For students who are Italian citizens, citizens of EU countries (regardless of their country of residence) and citizens of non-EU countries holding a residence permit in Italy
