Admission procedure for the Master's degree programme
with assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge in:

Ingegneria dell'Energia Elettrica Electrical Engineering

Faculty of Civil and Industrial Engineering

Degree Class: LM-28; code to be entered on Infostud: **33492**

1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.
The procedures and costs are set out in the section 'Single Examinations' of the Regulations for Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and for Student Fees

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities must, after paying €10.00, submit a self-declaration stating the exams they have taken, the scientific-disciplinary sectors corresponding to the courses, and the relevant syllabuses, using the form "Dichiarazione laurea ed esami per verifica dei requisiti" available on the University website, on the student forms page

The declaration must be submitted in one of the following ways:

- from the email address provided on Infostud at the time of registration, to the email address of your Student Affairs Office or to the address specified in the curriculum requirements, available in the degree programme catalogue on the page for each programme under the 'Enrolment' section. Before submitting your application, you

must check that you have uploaded your identity document to Infostud, under 'Profile > Personal Documents';

- from your certified email address to Sapienza's certified email address protocollosapienza@cert.uniroma1.it

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

Admission to the Master's Degree programme in Electrical Power Engineering requires a bachelor's degree (in the L-7, L-8 or L-9 degree classes) or another qualification obtained in Italy or abroad and recognised as suitable under current legislation.

The academic requirements stipulate that a minimum of 90 CFU must have been obtained in the following areas:

- at least 45 CFU in the subject area of core subjects [mathematics, MAT/01 (MATH-01/A), MAT/02 (MATH-02/A), MAT/03 (MATH-02/B), MAT/05 (MATH-03/A), MAT/06 (MATH-03/B), MAT/07 (MATH-04/A), MAT/08 (MATH-05/A), MAT/09 (MATH-06/A) – computer science, INF/01 (INFO-01/A), ING-INF/05 (IINF-05/A) – chemistry, CHIM/03 (CHEM-03/A), CHIM/07 (CHEM-06/A) – physics, FIS/01 (PHYS-01/A), PHYS-03/A), FIS/07 (PHYS-06/A) – statistics, SECS-S/02 (STAT-01/B), of which at least 18 CFU must be in the field of mathematics;

- at least 45 CFU in the subject areas characteristic of the classes of Industrial Engineering, Information Engineering and Civil and Environmental Engineering, or deemed equivalent by the Degree Programme Board, with specific reference to the fields of structural engineering, fluid dynamics and fluid machinery, energy systems, technical physics, electronics, computer science, automatic control, electrical engineering, measurement, and electrical power systems. At least 6 CFU must be obtained in the subject area of electrical engineering (ING-IND/31 - ILET-01/A).

Academic requirements are verified based on certification of the examinations taken during the degree programme; it is possible to obtain the missing CFU through single examinations. In any case, the CFU required to meet the academic requirements must be obtained prior to enrolment.

The Degree Programme Commission reserves the right to assess the content of the courses and examinations taken for the purpose of recognising equivalence.

Any cases not covered by the regulations will be examined by the Executive Committee of the Area Educational Board.

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The **result** of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

The procedures for assessing the suitability of applicants' academic background – to which only those who meet the academic entry requirements are eligible – are set out in the Academic Regulations, available on the degree programme's website.

The assessment of personal suitability is based on the mark obtained in the qualification required for admission to the Master's degree programme, which must be 90/110 or higher.

A good command of written and spoken English is also required, corresponding to level B2 of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages), which must be demonstrated by the student either through a specific certificate or by passing an English proficiency test.

Language proficiency may also be recognised if a B2-level language course has been successfully completed as part of the first-cycle degree programme, or through attendance at advanced language courses offered by the Faculty, provided the relevant test is passed prior to enrolment.

The certificates recognised by the Faculty, corresponding to a B2 level of the CEFR, are as follows:

- Cambridge FCE (or higher)
- IELTS level 6 (or higher)
- TOEFL internet-based 72 (or higher), paper-based 513 (or higher), or computer-based 183 (or higher)
- Trinity ISE2 (or higher)

These language skills are assessed in accordance with the procedures described in the course's academic regulations, which apply to Italian citizens, students from the European Union and international students.

The procedures for assessing the adequacy of individual knowledge, which are available only to students who meet the academic requirements, are set out in the academic regulations, available on the degree programme's website.

5. Enrolment

Enrolment is granted upon payment of the course enrolment fees, following the successful completion of the assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge.

The **payment slip** is generated via the Infostud system.

6. For students who hold a qualification from a foreign education system

The procedures vary depending on citizenship and country of residence.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo programme who have chosen the English-language programme

In these cases, you must hold a mandatory letter of pre-acceptance.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo project who have chosen the Italian-language programme

In this case, a letter of pre-acceptance is not required, but you must **pass the Italian language proficiency test** (level B2), or submit a certificate of proficiency in Italian at a level no lower than B2, as indicated in point 1 on the International Students' Office page. This requirement applies only to those applying for enrolment on a degree programme taught in Italian

For students who are Italian citizens, citizens of EU countries (regardless of their country of residence) and citizens of non-EU countries holding a residence permit in Italy
