1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.
The procedures and costs are set out in the section 'Single Examinations' of the Regulations for Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and for Student Fees

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities must, after paying €10.00, submit a self-declaration stating the exams they have taken, the scientific-disciplinary sectors corresponding to the courses, and the relevant syllabuses, using the form "Dichiarazione laurea ed esami per la verifica dei requisiti" available on the University website, on the student forms page

The declaration must be submitted in one of the following ways:

- from the email address provided on Infostud at the time of registration, to the email address of your Student Affairs Office or to the address specified in the academic requirements, available in the degree programme catalogue on the page for each programme under the 'Enrolment' section. Before submitting your application, you must check that you have uploaded your identity document to Infostud, under 'Profile > Personal Documents';

- from your certified email address to Sapienza's certified email address protocollosapienza@cert.uniroma1.it

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

The academic requirements are deemed to be met if the degree programme, university diploma or other recognised course of study completed by applicants for admission to the degree programme includes a minimum of 33 (thirty-three) University Credit Points (CFU), or an equivalent study load, acquired within the subject areas of the core subjects, as specified below:

- Mathematics, Probability and Statistics, Computer Science: SSD MATH-02/B, MATH-03/A, MATH-03/B, MATH-04/A, MATH-05/A, MATH-06/A, STAT-01/A, STAT-01/B, STAT-04/A, INFO-01/A, IINF-05/A (previously MAT/03, MAT/05, MAT/06, MAT/07, MAT/08, MAT/09, SECS-S/01, SECS-S/02; SECS-S/06, INF/01, ING-INF/05);
- Physics: SSD PHYS-01/A, PHYS-02/A, PHYS-05/B, PHYS-06/A (previously FIS/01, FIS/02, FIS/03, FIS/06; FIS/07);
- Chemistry: SSD CHEM-01/B, CHEM-03/A, CHEM-04/A, CHEM-05/A, CHEM-06/A (previously CHIM/12, CHIM/03, CHIM/04, CHIM/06, CHIM/07).

Applicants must also have completed at least 40 (forty) CFU, or an equivalent study load, in the following subject areas:

- Environmental and Land Engineering: SSD CHEM-01/B, GEOS-03/B, GEOS-04/B, CEAR-01/A, CEAR-01/B, CEAR-02/A, CEAR-04/A, CEAR-05/A, CEAR-06/A, ICHI-01/B, ICHI-02/A, ICHI-02/B, CEAR-02/B, CEAR-02/C, CEAR-02/D (previously: CHIM/12, GEO/05, GEO/11, ICAR/01, ICAR/02, ICAR/03, ICAR/06, ICAR/07, ICAR/08, ING-IND/24, ING-IND/25, ING-IND/27, ING-IND/28, ING-IND/29, ING-IND/30);
- Engineering for the management of civil and environmental systems: SSD CEAR-03/A, CEAR-03/B, CEAR-07/A, CEAR-12/A, IEGE-01/A, IINF-04/A (previously: ICAR/04, ICAR/05, ICAR/09, ICAR/20, ING-IND/35, ING-INF/04);
- Safety, Civil Protection, Environmental and Land-Use Engineering: SSD IIND-06/B, IIND-07/A, IIND-07/B, IMAT-01/A, IIET-01/A, IIND-08/B (previously: ING-IND/09, ING-IND/10, ING-IND/11, ING-IND/22, ING-IND/31, ING-IND/33);
- Industrial Engineering: SSD IIND-01/D, IIND-01/F, IIND-06/A, ICHI-01/C, IINF-05/A, IMIS-01/B (previously: ING-IND/04, ING-IND/06, ING-IND/08, ING-IND/26, ING-INF/05, ING-INF/07).

The academic requirements are automatically met if the applicant holds a Class L-7 degree in Civil and Environmental Engineering from any Italian university. Other qualifications, obtained in Italy or abroad, may also be considered eligible, subject to verification by the Degree Programme Committee that the course of study is consistent with the entry requirements. In addition to this, applicants must demonstrate a proven knowledge of English at a level no lower than B2 of the CEFR, either by submitting a language certificate recognised by the Faculty of Civil and Industrial Engineering or by having passed a B2-level language proficiency test as part of the programme leading to their three-year degree (or an equivalent qualification). Proof of B2-level language proficiency may be verified by passing the specific language tests organised by the Faculty of Civil and Industrial Engineering for the purposes of enrolment on master's degree programmes

Applicants seeking admission to the degree programme must meet the academic requirements in order to be eligible for the personal knowledge assessment.

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The payment is generated via the Infostud system.

The **payment** is made online via PagoPA (direct payment).

The **code** to be entered into the system is **34180**.

The result of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

Only those who meet the academic requirements may be assessed for the suitability of their personal knowledge. Applicants from a foreign university must have a GPA (Grade Point Average) for their three-year degree (or equivalent qualification) of 80 out of 100. For those from an Italian university, the assessment of academic suitability is based on the final mark for the three-year degree, which must be 85/110 or higher.

The procedures for assessing academic suitability, which are open only to students who meet the academic requirements, are set out in the Academic Regulations, available on the degree programme's website.

5. Enrolment

Enrolment is granted upon payment of the course enrolment fees, following the successful completion of the assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge.

6. For students who hold a qualification from a foreign education system

The procedures vary depending on citizenship and country of residence.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo programme who have chosen the English-language programme

In these cases, you must hold a mandatory letter of pre-acceptance.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo project who have chosen the Italian-language programme

In this case, a letter of pre-acceptance is not required, but you must **pass the Italian language proficiency test** (level B2), or submit a certificate of proficiency in Italian at a level no lower than B2, as indicated in point 1 on the International Students' Office page. This requirement applies only to those applying for enrolment on a degree programme taught in Italian

For students who are Italian citizens, citizens of EU countries (regardless of their country of residence) and citizens of non-EU countries holding a residence permit in Italy
