Admission procedure for the Master's degree programme
with assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge in:

Computer Science

Faculty of Information Engineering, Computer Science and Statistics
Degree Class: LM-18; code to be entered on Infostud: **33508**
Course taught in English

1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities must, after paying €10.00, send the following by email to the Teaching Committee of the Department of Computer Science: calamo@di.uniroma1.it by the same deadlines as those set for the application to verify entry requirements, a self-certification of the qualification obtained, specifying the degree class, the examinations taken and the scientific and disciplinary sectors corresponding to the courses studied, together with a copy of the payment receipt for the €10.00 fee. Failure to submit the declaration of previous academic background or a negative outcome of the assessment of curricular requirements will result in the inability to enrol on this degree programme.

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to

the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

To be admitted to the Master's degree programme in Computer Science, applicants must have earned at least 90 CFU (university credits) in the scientific disciplinary sectors (SSD) (or equivalent fields for those holding a qualification obtained abroad):

- INF/01
- ING-INF/01, ING-INF/02, ING-INF/03, ING-INF/04, ING-INF/05
- FIS/01, FIS/02, FIS/07
- MAT/01, MAT/02, MAT/03, MAT/05, MAT/06, MAT/07, MAT/08, MAT/09
- SECS-S/01, SECS-S/06.

In particular, of the 90 CFU required for admission to the above-mentioned fields, 72 CFU must be obtained in the scientific disciplines (SSD) covering core subjects (mathematics, physics, computer science), as well as disciplines characteristic of computer science, with specific reference to subjects relating to ICT (Information and Communication Technology), data science, mathematical and physical sciences, and information engineering.

Knowledge of the fundamental aspects of computer science relating to programming languages, algorithms and data structures, computer architectures, databases, computer networks, operating systems, and the theory of computability and complexity is also required.

As this is a Master's degree programme taught in English, proficiency in English at B2 level or above is required.

The procedures for verifying that candidates meet the academic requirements and possess the necessary personal aptitude are set out in the Academic Regulations and published on the programme's website. For international students, specific procedures for assessing personal knowledge are in place, which are also published on the programme's website.

Those who do not meet the admission requirements may enrol for single courses and take the relevant examinations before enrolling on the Master's degree programme, as provided for in the Regulations on Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and Student Fees.

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The payment is generated via the Infostud system.

The **payment** is made online via PagoPA (direct payment).

The **code** to be entered into the system is **33508**.

The result of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

The assessment of personal knowledge will be carried out taking into account the degree class achieved, the final degree mark and the results obtained in examinations relating to the scientific and disciplinary sectors of the field of computer science.

Admission will be approved by the Committee for the Assessment of Personal Knowledge for those who have obtained a degree in classes L-31 or L-8 with a mark of no less than 100/110. Otherwise, should the applicant's academic background not be deemed fully adequate, they will be required to pass an admission interview, designed to assess their knowledge of the fundamental aspects of computer science, relating in particular to: algorithms and data structures, programming languages, computer architectures, databases, computer networks and operating systems.

It is recommended that you submit your application for verification of eligibility and personal knowledge well in advance, in order to receive the necessary guidance for preparing for the admission interview in good time.

Proficiency in English at a minimum B2 level must be demonstrated through appropriate certification. Alternatively, candidates will be required to take an interview, in accordance with the instructions provided by the Committee for the assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge, alongside the outcome of the assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge.

Those who hold an Italian three-year degree (obtained at Sapienza or another university) and wish to apply for an assessment of their academic qualifications and personal knowledge must send their documentation by email to: calamo@di.uniroma1.it

5. Enrolment

Enrolment is granted upon payment of the course enrolment fees, following the successful completion of the assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge.

The payment slip is generated via the Infostud system.

6. For students who hold a qualification from a foreign education system

For students of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo programme
