Admission procedure for the Master's degree programme
with assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge in:

Telecommunication Engineering

Faculty of Information Engineering, Computer Science and Statistics

Course taught in English

1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities must, after paying the €10.00 fee, send the following by email to the Student Affairs Office (segreteria didattica@diag.uniroma1.it) by the same deadlines as those set for the application to verify entry requirements, a self-certification of their degree, specifying the degree class, the examinations taken and the scientific and disciplinary sectors corresponding to the courses studied, together with a copy of the payment receipt for the €10.00 fee.

Failure to submit the declaration of previous academic history or a favourable outcome of the assessment of academic requirements will result in the inability to enrol on that specific degree programme.

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to

the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

To be admitted to the Master's Degree Programme in Telecommunication Engineering, applicants must meet the following academic requirements:

- hold a three-year degree or university diploma, or an equivalent qualification obtained abroad and recognised as suitable;
- have earned at least 120 university credits (CFU) in the following scientific-disciplinary sectors (SSD):
 - Mathematical and Computer Sciences: MAT/*, INF/01
 - Physical Sciences: FIS/*
 - Information Engineering: ING-INF/*
 - Industrial Engineering: ING-IND/*
 - Statistical Sciences: SECS-S/01, SECS-S/02

provided that at least 60 CFU have been obtained in the fields FIS/*, MAT/* and ING-INF/*.

The following are also required:

- knowledge of the English language, both written and spoken, at a level no lower than B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR);
- adequate personal background in the basic scientific disciplines (mathematics and physics) and in the core disciplines of information engineering, with particular reference to the field of telecommunications engineering.

The procedures for assessing adequate language skills and personal background are briefly outlined in point 4. For further details, please refer to the Degree Programme's Academic Regulations.

Furthermore, applicants from non-EU countries residing abroad who are applying for a student visa for the 2026–2027 academic year are required to hold a letter of pre-acceptance (Online Preselection Application – Sapienza University of Rome, <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/admissions>)

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The payment is generated via the Infostud system.

The **payment** is made online via PagoPA (direct payment).

The **code** to be entered into the system is **33510**.

The **result** of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

Only those who meet the academic requirements are eligible to proceed to the assessment of their personal knowledge.

The assessment is carried out by a committee appointed by the Area Educational Board for Telecommunications Engineering, which is tasked with evaluating candidates' personal knowledge on the basis of the following criteria:

- average mark for the three-year degree;
- the time taken to complete the degree;
- the relevance of the study programme for the first-cycle degree;
- other extracurricular activities, including work experience and other training activities;
- certification attesting to language proficiency;
- an interview, if required.

Depending on the outcome of the assessment, tailored study programmes of up to a maximum of 36 CFU may be identified in order to ensure that those admitted to the Master's Degree Programme in Telecommunications Engineering can participate effectively in the programme.

6. For students who hold a qualification from a foreign education system
