1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.
The procedures and costs are set out in the section 'Single Examinations' of the Regulations for Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and for Student Fees

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities, after paying the €10.00 fee, must email the following documents to the Student Affairs Office of the Department of Statistical Sciences (didattica-dss@uniroma1.it) with the subject line: "Verification of SMA Master's Programme admission requirements"):

1. a self-certification of the qualification obtained (specifying the degree class), the examinations taken (specifying the ECTS credits and scientific-disciplinary sector for each examination) and any language certificates;
2. a copy of the payment receipt for the €10.00 fee;
3. a copy of an identity document.

Failure to submit the above documentation or a negative outcome of the academic requirements check will result in the inability to enrol on this specific degree programme.

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

Admission to the Master's degree programme is open to students who hold a Bachelor's degree (or equivalent) and who have earned a sufficient number of credits in relevant scientific and disciplinary fields within the core and specialisation areas of Class L-41 (the class of degrees in Statistical Sciences).

For the purposes of admission, applicants must meet the academic requirements listed below as RC1 and RC2 and possess the appropriate personal background listed below as APP1 and APP2.

RC1. Hold a three-year university degree or diploma, or another qualification obtained abroad deemed suitable.

RC2. Have acquired at least 60 university credits across the scientific and disciplinary sectors indicated in the following areas (the sectors defined by Ministerial Decree No. 639 of 2 May 2024 are shown in brackets):

- Area 01 (Mathematical and Computer Sciences): MAT/* (MATH-*), INF/01 (INF-01/A)
- Area 02 (Physical Sciences): FIS/01 (PHYS-01/A, PHYS-03/A), FIS/02 (PHYS-02/A, PHYS-04/A), FIS/07 (PHYS-06/A)
- Area 06 (Medical Sciences): MED/01 (MEDS-24/A)
- Area 09 (Industrial and Information Engineering): ING-IND/35 (IEGE-01/A), ING-INF/05 (INF-05/A), ING-INF/06 (IBIO-01/A)
- Area 11 (Historical, Philosophical, Pedagogical and Psychological Sciences): M-PSI/03 (PSIC-01/C)
- Area 13 (Economic and Statistical Sciences): SECS-S/* (STAT-*), SECS-P/* (ECON-*, STEC-*)
- Area 14 (Political and Social Sciences): SPS/07 (GSPS-06/A).

APP1. APP1. Knowledge of concepts in Mathematics, Probability and Statistics. In particular:

- Mathematics – Basic elements of differential and integral calculus, functions of one or more variables, linear algebra and analytical geometry.
- Probability – Properties of probability; random variables; concepts of convergence of sequences of random variables.
- Statistics – Elements of descriptive statistics. Inferential statistics: sample distributions; methods for estimating parameters; tests for verifying parametric hypotheses.
- Computer Science – Knowledge of at least one programming language.

APP2. APP2. Knowledge of English at B2 level or above.

For anyone who meets the academic requirements RC1 and RC2 and has also certified knowledge of English at B2 level or above (APP2), the assessment of adequate knowledge of Mathematics, Probability, Statistics and Computer Science (APP1) is carried out by a specific committee appointed by the relevant academic department. For the purposes of this

assessment, the Committee takes the candidate's academic record into account and, where deemed appropriate, a interview must be undertaken, which may also be used to assess the required level of English language proficiency in the absence of a language certificate. On the basis of the assessment of the curriculum and the outcome of any interview, the Committee may identify specific study pathways which, in accordance with the course's curriculum, include courses not yet completed and deemed essential for the student's education.

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The result of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

The assessment of personal knowledge APP1 and APP2 is carried out provided that the academic requirements (points RC1 and RC2) are met.

The procedures for assessing the suitability of personal knowledge – to which only those who meet the academic requirements are eligible – are set out in the Academic Regulations, available on the degree programme's website.
