Admission methods for the Master's Degree with entry requirements and academic knowledge assessment in:

Cultural Heritage in the Near and Middle East, and in Africa

Faculty of Arts and Humanities Class: LM-2; code to be entered on Infostud: **33541** Degree programme delivered in English

1. Stages of the procedure

For admission to the master's degree, it is required to:

- a. **Pay** the €10,00 fee in compliance with the methods and deadlines indicated in section 3.
- b. Wait for the outcome of the entry requirements assessment. If the requirements are not met, it is possible to acquire the missing credits by passing single exams. The methods and costs are set out in "Single Courses" of the Student Regulations Go to the Student Regulations
- c. **Carry out the academic knowledge assessment** in the modalities indicated in section 4.
- d. **Proceed to enrolment** by paying the master's degree enrolment tuition fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines indicated in section 5. Enrolment can only take place when the Student Affairs Office sends an email notification of the successful outcome of the entry requirements and academic knowledge assessment.

For candidates from other Italian universities

Applicants from other Italian universities, after paying the €10,00 fee, must submit a selfcertification indicating the exams taken, the scientific disciplines corresponding to the subjects, and relating syllabuses using the form "*Dichiarazione laurea ed esami*" available on the University Website at the student forms page <u>https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/student-forms</u> Submissions must be made in one of the following ways:

 from the email address indicated on Infostud at the time of registration to the email address of your Student Affairs Office or the address indicated in the curricular requirements, available in the Course Catalogue, on the page of each degree programme, in the Enrolment section. Before submitting your application, you must check that you have uploaded your identification document on Infostud, under the section "Profile>Personal documents"; from your personal certified e-mail address to the Sapienza University of Rome certified e-mail address <u>protocollosapienza@cert.uniroma1.it</u>

For candidates who have not graduated yet

If the programme regulations provide for it, candidates who have not yet graduated (from Sapienza University of Rome or other universities) may also apply for entry requirements assessment, without prejudice to the obligation to graduate by January 24, 2026 (for those who have not yet graduated from Sapienza University of Rome) and by December 20, 2025 (for those who have not yet graduated from other Italian and international universities).

For candidates from foreign countries and/or with an educational qualification obtained in a non-Italian education system

Procedures for candidates coming from foreign countries are indicated in section 6.

2. Entry requirements

Admission to the Master's Degree in "Cultural Heritage in the Near and Middle East, and in Africa" requires holding a three-year university degree or diploma, or another qualification obtained abroad, deemed suitable.

Admission will be based on the assessment of curricular requirements in the disciplines of antiquity and oriental sciences, philological-literary, historical-artistic, historical, philosophical, pedagogical and psychological sciences, as well as legal, economic and statistical sciences and political-social sciences. For access to the Degree Programme, English language knowledge and skills at level B2 must be ascertained. In the absence of certification, the language level will be ascertained by the Admission Committee.

For admission to the Degree Programme, an interview with the Programme Coordinator is also envisaged, aimed at assessing academic knowledge. During the interview, knowledge and skills in English at B2 level will also be ascertained. In the absence of a language certificate, the level of English language proficiency may be assessed directly by the Programme Coordinator during the interview.

There are no specific Further Required Courses (OFAs). Instead, the Programme's Quality Management Team monitors past and incoming careers in order to identify critical issues and define targeted interventions to facilitate the integration of those coming from different degree classes and from different Italian or international universities.

3. Entry requirements assessment

The assessment of entry requirements is requested by paying a fee of €10,00 from July 2, 2025 to one of the following dates of your choice:

- September 16, 2025 (only date available for non-EU candidates who request a student visa)
- October 16, 2025
- November 18, 2025
- December 16, 2025
- January 15, 2026 (date reserved for those who have already graduated or are about to graduate from Sapienza University of Rome).

Payment is generated on the Infostud system. **Payment** is made online via PagoPA (direct payment). The code to be entered in the system is **33541**. <u>Read the instructions</u>

The outcome of the entry requirements assessment will be communicated to the institutional mailbox (if activated) or to the personal email address declared on Infostud.

4. Academic knowledge assessment

Admission will take place based on the assessment of the curricular requirements and the assessment of the academic career, and, if deemed necessary, through an interview aimed at assessing the academic knowledge.

The Master's Degree in "Cultural Heritage in the Near and Middle East, and in Africa" is delivered in English. For admission to the Degree Programme, an assessment of B2 level of English language proficiency is required. In the absence of certification, the language level will be ascertained by the Admission Committee.

It is possible to identify differentiated study plans within the Master's degree depending on the curricular requirements met and/or the result of the assessment of academic knowledge, but these study plans will still lead to a Master's degree with 120 ECTS, without additional educational activities.

The methods for assessing the adequacy of academic knowledge, which is only open to those who meet the curricular requirements, are contained in the Didactic Regulations, available on the degree programme's website.

5. Enrolment

Enrolment is obtained through payment of the programme enrolment tuition fees, after successful completion of the assessment of entry requirements and academic knowledge.

6. For candidates with an educational qualification obtained within a non-Italian education system

Procedures differ according to nationality and country of residence.

For those with citizenship in non-EU countries, residing abroad and applying for a study visa, and for those from China and participating in the Marco Polo project In these cases, it is necessary to have the mandatory pre-acceptance letter.

The procedures to be followed are indicated in section 7 of the International Student Office page

Enrolment procedures for those with an educational qualification from a non-Italian education system

Following the successful outcome of the entry requirements assessment, or upon receipt of the pre-acceptance letter, those holding an educational qualification obtained in a non-Italian education system must complete the enrolment procedure for the two-year Master's degree programme as indicated in section 4 of the International Student Office page Go to section 4
