1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.
The procedures and costs are set out in the section 'Single Examinations' of the Regulations for Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and for Student Fees

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities, after paying the €10.00 fee, are required, by the deadlines set for the verification of eligibility, to submit the following scanned documents via the dedicated Google Form available at the following link: [Go to page](#)

- Curriculum Vitae (in European format);
- Self-certification of the qualification obtained, specifying the examinations taken and the scientific/disciplinary fields (SSD) of the courses (A template is available on the page indicated [Go to page](#));
- Official certificate of language proficiency at B2 level (alternatively, a self-certification form based on the template available on the page indicated [Go to page](#));
- Copy of the payment receipt for the €10.00 fee;
- A copy of a valid identity document.

Please note that failure to submit the declaration of previous academic history, or the discovery that academic requirements have not been met, will result in the inability to enrol on the specified degree programme.

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

To be admitted, the following requirements must be met:

- (a) Hold a bachelor's degree or a three-year university diploma, or another qualification obtained abroad that is deemed equivalent;
- (b) Have acquired at least 44 university credits (CFU) in the following scientific disciplines:
 - at least 18 CFU in the subject area of core subjects (mathematics, physics, computer science, statistics) from among MAT/02, MAT/03, MAT/05, MAT/06, FIS/01, INF/01, SECS-S/01;
 - at least 24 CFU distributed at the applicant's discretion across the subject areas of scientific and technological studies, electrical and electronic engineering, telecommunications engineering, management engineering, computer engineering, economic and social sciences, and legal disciplines, from among MAT/08, MAT/09, INF/01, ING-INF/01, ING-INF/02, ING-INF/03, ING-INF/04, ING-INF/05, ING-IND/31, ING-IND/35, SECS-P/06, SECS-P/07, SECS-P/08, SECS-P/10, IUS/01 and IUS/20.

Furthermore, knowledge of English at B2 level is required.

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The payment is generated via the Infostud system.

The **payment** is made online via PagoPA (direct payment).

The **code** to be entered into the system is **33516**.

The result of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

An assessment of personal knowledge will be carried out provided that the admission requirements are met.

To be admitted, **the following documents must be submitted** by the same deadlines as those set for submitting the application for the assessment of eligibility:

- curriculum vitae;
- self-certification of the qualification obtained, specifying the examinations taken and the relevant scientific-disciplinary sectors (SSD);
- a copy of the proof of payment of the fee for the eligibility check;
- a copy of a valid identity document;
- proof of proficiency in English.

The above documentation **must be submitted exclusively via the dedicated Google Form available at the following link:** [Go to page](#).

A committee specifically appointed by the Degree Programme Commission will assess applicants' personal knowledge within one month of the application, based on the following criteria:

- relevance of the undergraduate degree curriculum;
- other extracurricular activities, including work experience and other training activities;
- knowledge of English at B2 level;
- an interview (which may be conducted remotely).

The procedures for assessing the suitability of candidates' personal knowledge, which are only available to students who meet the academic requirements, are set out in the Academic Regulations, available on the degree programme's website.
